Hi Lauren,

Further to our representation of 7 July 2023 on the draft assessment criteria referred to the Department under section 60ZL(1) of the LUPA Act, we provide the following additional advice for inclusion in the 'Guidance on Information' section of Section 4.6 Land use and coastal values.

Guidance on information

The MPIS is to:

- indicate which management practices are expected to be given effect through a major project permit.
- be informed by any guidance provided to the Panel by the PWS on the level of assessment required and the methodology for undertaking environmental assessments.
- contain an assessment of recreation impacts and management including maps that describe the assessment of current recreation setting and opportunity and likely impacts.

The assessment of likely impacts on opportunities for recreation and the quality of recreation in the area should be informed by considering:

- potential temporary and permanent impacts on recreational settings and opportunities in the area including access and visual amenity.
- potential for displacement of recreational activities away from or to recreation in the windfarm area.
- visual impact and scenic amenity impacts (see s4.5.1 of these assessment criteria).
- PWS advice on visitor management and reserve management objectives including encouraging appropriate recreational use.
