1977 Appointed Environmental Health Officer, Kingborough Municipality. Council's Planning and Health Department. Providing Environmental Health advice to the council planner in relation to subdivisions.

1977 Appointed Health Officer, Division of Public Health, State Health Department. Senior Health Officer (1987-1989) Providing Environmental Health advice to Local Government Environmental Health Officers in relation subdivision proposals in non-sewered areas. Advice was also provided to the Commission for Town and Country Planning. On-site wastewater disposal techniques were also improved during this time to allow smaller lot sizes.

In 1990 Completed a Graduate Diploma in Environmental Studies at the University of Tasmania (UTAS). This course examined the social, economic and regulatory contexts that surround the management and monitoring of environmental and ecosystem health. During this course a detailed study was undertaken of all rural subdivision in the lower Kingborough and Port Cygnet Municipalities in relation to the subdivision of agriculturally important rural land and the subsequent loss of this resource to the region.

In 1991 Completed a Graduate Diploma in Applied Science (Viticulture) Charles Sturt University. This course provided the necessary skills to develop a vineyard at his Hartzview Vineyard Gardners Bay property, together with winemaking skills. Hartzview Vineyard currently employs

10 part time and fulltime positions. Hartzview Vineyard has won three Tasmanian Tourism Awards.

1989-1992 Appointed Chief Environmental Health Officer for the City of Clarence. As part of the senior management team advice was provided to council planners in relation to environmental matters associated with non-sewered subdivisions.

Worked as an environmental consultant on a number of projects in Tasmania, South Australia, New South Wales and Queensland. This included council environmental projects and projects in the Huon for Forestry Tasmania.

2008 Completed Master of Environmental Management UTAS. This course was a researched based degree into the barriers to technology transfer from Developed to Developing Nations. This work was of particular importance to my work in emergency management following natural disasters.

Following the Boxing Day Tsunami Robert Patterson deployed to Banda Aceh as an Environmental Health Specialist for the Tasmanian Government. His team was responsible for providing on-site wastewater design assessment and installation training for the Field Septic Tank (FST) sanitation system training for a number of NGOs. The Tasmanian Government had donated ninety 300 person FST systems which Robert Patterson invented. Safe field sanitation was provided for 27,000 displaced persons in camps throughout Aceh. Other humanitarian relief projects undertaken by Lieutenant Patterson include Uganda (Cholera outbreak), UNTAET in support of UN, Cook Islands, Christchurch earthquake, Samoa and Fiji following Cyclone Winston.

He developed and lectured in the water and wastewater/humanitarian component of the University of Tasmania Bachelor of Health Science (Environmental Health).

Army Reserve Career

Since 1970 Robert Patterson has been an active Army Reservist.

He has deployed on three Operational Deployments to Bougainville in 1998 and East Timor 1999 as the Senior Health Officer (J07). He has commanded the 10th Field

Ambulance and 2nd Force Support Battalion (Hobart base Units) He is a graduate of the Australian Command and Staff College in Canberra and was a senior instructor from 2000-2005.

Lieutenant Colonel Patterson retired on 24th January, 2019 after 48.6 years of effective service. Reserve Force Decoration (Federation Star)
