Thank you for notifying TasRail of the above matter and the opportunity to provide comments on same to the Tasmanian Planning Commission.

TasRail has reviewed the available documentation and submits the following comment:

- We note that the over the counter, pop-up refund points and container refund machines or bag drop refund
 points on a registered trailer can only be for a period of not longer than two (2) days. TasRail requests that
 these sites specifically exclude any part of State Rail Network land and cannot be located at any location
 with potential to obscure required sighting distances and/or safety controls at a railway crossing. This
 request applies to rail crossings (vehicle and pedestrian) on public roads and also private rail crossings.
- Should the container refund scheme set-up on sites adjoining State Rail Network land, TasRail requests consideration be given to identifying and mitigating any perceived risks associated with what could potentially be incompatible land use (i.e. people, vehicles interfacing with an operational rail corridor).
- For the purpose of clarity, the rail corridor is defined as all State Rail Network land.
