

Summary of representations

840 representations on the draft integrated assessment report for the Macquarie Point Multipurpose Stadium Project of State Significance (the Project) were received. 103 representations were in support of the Project, 706 were in opposition to the Project, and 31 were comments that were neither in support or opposition.

1	David Champ	The representor supported the proposal. The representor submitted that the stadium would influence and encourage future generations and support participation in sport.
2	Glenn Schultes	The representor raised concerns about the cost, revenue stream, short term employment, and other priorities including health and public transport such as light rail.
3	Shane Abel	The representor supported the proposal. The representor submitted that the height of cruise ships visiting Hobart exceed the height of the stadium and block the view of the cenotaph to Sandy Bay, disagreed with the draft IAR statement on strong winds effecting people waiting for a bus and considered that the land the stadium is being built on is at no cost, and to apply a value or cost is incorrect.
4	Gemma Saltmarsh	The representor raised concerns about the cost, the economic viability other priorities such as health and education, the scale, overshadowing, the Cenotaph, investing in local sports facilities and programs.
5	Scott Brierley	The representor submitted that the stadium costs outweigh the benefits and noted the additional costs associated with infrastructure additions like car parks, transport links, lighting, the relocation of the tram shed and the existing venues in Launceston and Bellerive.
6	Paul Fitzpatrick	The representor supported the proposal. The representor submitted that the stadium would bring benefits to the whole state, by way of tourism, hospitality, job creation, confidence and pride in Tasmania, and noted that a majority, 208,000 people had signed up for a Tasmania Devils membership.
7	Jade McKay	The representor considers the issues raised in the draft IAR need to be addressed including traffic congestion during events, pedestrian and bus access, cost, the stadium's appearance and integration with the landscape, impacts on the local neighbourhood and other priorities including health and housing.
8	Luke Jackson	The representor raised concerns with cost, build timeline, community benefit, and process regarding the site selection and business case.
9	Ryan Kincade	The representor supported the proposal. The representor submitted that the stadium will be the catalyst for decades of on-going economic activity, noted the positive impacts of the stadium such as the pride that associated events such as AFL and other events will bring, the positive impacts of a modern piece of infrastructure, and submitted that there is a cost for any infrastructure project but the positives should not only be looked at from an economic perspective.
10	David Mason	The representor raised concerns with cost, traffic congestion, and the proportion of the stadium to the CBD which will detract from the waterfront's visual appeal and affect views from several neighbourhoods.
11	Andrew Heard	The representor supported the findings in the draft IAR. The representor raised concerns about the location, the site size, financial impact the cost, existing venues at Bellerive & York Park and traffic.
12	Danny Gillespie	The representor raised concerns about the existing uses of the site, the cost, cost-benefit, traffic, other suitable locations.
13	Cameron Stone	The representor supported the proposal. The representor submitted that the state needs to change/evolve/develop to provide consistent job opportunities and noted the success of Mona and the Jack Jumpers. The representor considered that not having the stadium deprives people of live sport, music concerts and various other forms of entertainment that currently do not occur on a consistent and large scale basis within the state.

14	Lachie Baird	The representor supported the proposal. The representor submitted that the stadium would bring the community together, boost the local economy, and create lasting social and cultural benefits, boost health and wellbeing, boost Tasmania's economy, will create jobs, and accelerate improved public transport and the upgrade of infrastructure.
15	Jen Warren	The representor raised concerns about heritage impacts, the cost and safety concerns.
16	Cam Johnson	The representor supported the proposal. The representor submitted that the stadium should be built within 2km of Hobart's CBD to avoid it becoming underused like the DEC and noted that its proximity to businesses, bars, and restaurants is crucial as post-game crowds will spend significantly, benefiting traders and creating jobs. The representor submitted that a fixed roof is impractical, and suggested a retractable roof is needed for weather flexibility and cleanliness.
17	Wayne Thurston	The representor supported the proposal. The representor noted the economic benefits to the state, and the sense of pride, and jobs the stadium will bring.
18	Rod Nash	The representor supported the proposal. The representor noted the economic benefits to the state and gave examples of the Adelaide stadium and its benefits to that state. The representor noted that other stadiums have faced similar problems and that any project of this size will have cost overruns.
19	Nathanael Brooks-English	The representor raised concerns about traffic, noise for residents during major events. The representor also raised concerns with the cost, traffic congestion and that the funds could be invested in upgraded hospitals, schools/university that would drive far more economic value to Hobart. The representor considered that musical and other performance based events will be deterred from holding events in Tasmania due to the expense of transporting equipment across the Bass Strait.
20	Ed van Galen	The representor raised concerns about the cost and the existing venue at York Park.
21	Rod Irvin	The representor raised concerns with the cost, existing stadiums at York Park and Bellerive, funding of essential services, the design, roof shadowing, climate control inside the stadium, traffic management and congestion.
22	Dion Clarke	The representor submitted that the opposition to the stadium ignores the massive long-term benefits, including the AFL and AFLW team, Federal funding, construction and stadium jobs, the High-Performance Centre, sponsorship deals, visiting football, the boost to grassroots football, major concerts, and extra infrastructure investment.
23	Oliver Mann	The representor was opposed to the construction of the stadium, supported the issues expressed in the draft IAR and considered that Tasmania has far more pressing needs than a new stadium.
24	Dale Brown	The representor raised concerns with traffic congestion, parking, vibration, noise, impact Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra, the cost and the Cenotaph.
26	Doug Bolam	The representor supported the proposal. The representor did not agree with the financial assessments in the draft IAR and questioned the accuracy of the costs and income assessment, noted the importance of the stadium to the new AFL Club and that without it, the AFL teams will not exist, and any economic benefits and funding will not flow.
27	John Cook	The representor raised concerns about the impact on state debt, the cost, cost-benefit, other priorities such as education, health, and social services, heritage impacts, planning, and transport.
28	Michelle Singer	The representor raised concerns about the cost, the use of the site, the visual impact, the location, traffic congestions, public transport, pedestrian movement, other priorities including health, education, transport and public services, and existing venues such as Ninja Stadium.
29	MinterEllison for Crown in Right of Tasmania	The representation noted the inadequacy of draft IAR. The representor submitted that there are manifest errors in the draft IAR, including: (a) The unreasonable extension of the Project outside of the defined boundary in the Order, so as to include further or other projects, rendering relevant provisions of the SPP Act unworkable, given the operation of the SPP Act to 'turn off' the planning provisions that would apply to use or development. Please refer to Figure 1.3 of the Draft IAR which outlines the extent of this boundary extension, and is attached as Attachment 1 to this letter for ease of reference.

		(b) The discussion and assessment of the business and investment case, which appears to extend to matters of the State economy, budget decisions, total state sector debt, credit rating and the alternative use of funds, is irrelevant and beyond the reasonable scope of economic considerations for the purposes of an assessment under the SPP Act and the Objectives of the Resource Management and Planning System of Tasmania. (c) Adoption of significant portions of the “Gruen Report” which includes untested and incorrect assumptions. Dr Gruen was not listed as a Relevant Agency identified by the Advisory Council prior to the release of the Draft IAR. (d) Despite purporting to raise issues only, the Draft IAR makes “findings” on critical matters prior to consideration of representations, or without consideration of potential mitigations such as through design or conditions of approval. The Draft IAR appears to present opinions without presenting a reasoned or informed basis. (e) The Draft IAR fails to properly assess the Project as intended by the application of s19 of the SPP Act. The representor submitted that: - the Draft IAR does not comply with the requirements of the SPP Act. - It contains errors of law, approach and analysis. The representor submitted that on this basis, the Draft IAR should be given limited, if any, weight.
30	Bruce Lindsay	The representor supported the draft IAR. The representors raised concerns about the cost, the location, the size, heritage and planning impacts, and existing UTAS stadium venue for AFL.
31	Penny Lane	The representor supported the draft IAR. The representor raised concerns about the cost, other priorities including health and social housing, the location, and upgrading the Launceston stadium.
32	Sadie Roberts	The representor raised concerns about the cost, the overstated benefits, other priorities including education and health.
33	Ian Abernethy	The representor raised concerns with the stadium footprint and its isolation from other parts of the precinct, the cost-benefit, public transport, car parking, the scale, and the impact on the waterfront and heritage values of the area.
34	Geoff Grimes	The representor raised concerns about the location, the scale, the historic waterfront, the cost, traffic congestion and pedestrian movement.
35	Rose Mere	The representor raised concern about the economic impacts, the cost, and other priorities including hospitals.
36	Mark Skinner	The representor raised concern about state debt, the cost and the visual impacts.
37	Anthony Bennett	The representor raised concerns about the AFL deal, other priorities including the homeless, roads, hospital, and police force, existing venues for AFL, the cost and impact on state debt.
38	Shane Abel	The representor submitted that further investigation into the real stadium cost was required and gave the Christchurch stadium as an example.
39	Sue Abbott	The representor raised concern about the cost, impact on state debt, other priorities including health, public housing, education, public transport, and mental health services.
40	Menna Jones	The representor supported the draft IAR. impacts on heritage buildings and the cityscape, the Cenotaph and the waterfront, traffic congestion, the cost, impact on state debt, and other priorities including health and education, existing stadiums for where AFL games can be played, and the use of the site.
41	Lou Cox	The representor raised concern about the site suitability, traffic, pedestrian access, the cost, the cost-benefit, impact on state debt and the AFL deal.
42	ALTRAC Light Rail	The representor supported the proposal. The represented submitted support for light rail and referenced ALTRAC Light Rail operating the Sydney Light Rail network.
43	Katherine Maher	The representor raised concerns about the negative economic and social effects, upgrading existing venues, the location and the use of the site.
44	Richard Wilson	The representor submitted that that Commission has clearly overlooked the fact that regardless of this specific development proposal, any stadium or significant development on this site will dominate views from any perspective due to the site's iconic location. The representor noted that the site is an industrial wasteland next to a working port on reclaimed land, that the Engineers Building stands as a historic outlier on the site, the northern access road is highly important to the port and Hobart's economic future, and will

		take heavy vehicle traffic away from Hunter Street and that large cruise vessels regularly berth alongside the Port.
45	June Harper	The representor raised concerns about the cost, impact on state debt, the financial viability, existing venues such as Ninja and UTAS Stadiums, the roof, the design, the heritage impact, public transport infrastructure, car parking, the Domain and the Cenotaph.
46	Andrew Flies	The representor raised concerns about the cost, cost-benefit and traffic congestion. The representor cited a report which detailed that predicted economic benefits for stadiums are rarely achieved.
47	Clare Scallon	The representor raised concerns about parking, public transport, the location, the cost, and other priorities including housing, education, health care, and the number of events that will travel to Hobart.
48	Wilfred Hodgman	The representor raised concerns about the visual impact on Sullivans Cove and Hobart, the size, the impact on historical significance, the railway history of the site, and the Goods Shed.
49	George Zam	The representor supported the draft IAR. The representor raised concerns about economic impact, impact on state debt, other priorities such as health, housing and education, and the location.
50	Niko Stoner	The representor raised concerns about the cost, impact on state debt, the lack of public transport infrastructure.

The Draft IAR appears to present opinions without presenting a reasoned or informed basis. (e) The Draft IAR fails to properly assess the Project as intended by the application of s19 of the SPP Act. (f) Merits-based assessment of technical planning and environment issues. (g) The Draft IAR contains errors of law, approach and analysis. It lacks balance to support the making of representations. The representor included a table providing 102 comments on the draft IAR.
